Welcome to the 2024 Pittwater Sailors season. Best of luck to all competitors in the Annual Point score and the shorter concurrent Winter and Spring series. So, there are lots of trophies to aim for.

We had 13 boats compete in the first race of the season, which was a great turnout given the hot humid weather and a forecast for 20 to 25 Knot winds in the afternoon! It was good to see Mike Tasker in Kombu was able to race and Richard Steel Rhythm with his new Young99.

The NE breeze was light around 10knots at the start with the bold seen carrying their big headsails while the more conservative started with smaller headsails. The first half of the race was sailed in light winds with slow steady going in the heat and then the NE came in and we were all off. Such was the competition and handicapping that most of the boats finished in 2 close bunches making it particularly challenging for the folk on the start boat. Andrew Latimer videoed the finish from the start boat which helped sort out the boat finish sequence.

The place getters in Yellow Division were first Just Magic, second Turning Point and third Dancelot and for Blue Division first Unlimited, second Nickerlyn and third Jacana who all finished within one minute of each other.
