Hi Everyone,

The forecast for Sunday as everyone knows, was for relentless heavy showers and rain all day but the wind forecast had moderated. After some consultation with a handful of skippers there was not a lot of enthusiasm on Saturday to race Sunday. However, we decided to make the final call at 10.00AM and lo and behold it had not rained since dawn, the sky was light but there was no breeze. The day looked good so off we went.

Paul and Lena Aizana with their lovely boat "Rusty Nails" filled in as our start boat for the day, Sheree Nathan filled in as race officer bringing her experience in the requirements for the day and was joined by Bernard Kennelly who has volunteered to be part of our start boat crew. Welcome Bernard and thank you all.

It was with some relief that I saw from Nickerlyn at 11.30am that there were some other boats out there getting ready to race. The breeze was very light, less than 5knots at 11.45am when we must decide on the course, I selected the short course 8 thinking that we will at least get everyone finished before the forecast rain would surely arrive. When it came for us to start at 12.26pm there was a nice 8 to 10 knot southerly as forecast! Unfortunately, we had only one boat sail in Yellow Division, but we had 5 boats in Blue Division including David Cunningham in Karma 3 who is sailing the first 3 races in the winter series. Welcome David. Course 8 is laid out in such a manner to enable boats to finish the race. The works only had a tack or two and so the race became a bit of a procession except for the robust efforts Karma 3 made to block Nickerlyn passing. (we go back a long way). Race Courses Design and Lengths

Course 1 for both Blue and Yellow Divisions have been modified to force some tacking should the breeze swing from North towards the NE which happened during the April race. I have emailed you all the revised courses.

Regarding concerns that Yellow Division Course 5 is too long I have undertaken a detailed review of the course lengths using digital tracking of several races we have sailed Nickerlyn in RMYC and the PAC races. Paul Toomey initially used Strava, a running and cycling app that has a tracking feature and is currently evaluating Water Sports Tracker, which gives excellent data. The apps track of our races is a great help in fixing the position of all the buoys that we use in Pittwater on my nautical map.

I hope to get some input from Ken Plumb regarding the changes this data makes to most of the course distances. More to follow next month.

Whilst we are fortunate to have Bernard Kennelly joining the Start Boat Crew, we are still seeking another volunteer on a casual and a more regular basis. The Start Boat experience is a pleasant way to spend a Sunday on Pittwater.
